
MY PLANNING STRATEGIES & TIPS...

- 1. Have the acheivement standards and curriculum for the learning area in front of me (including learning intentions);
- 2. Plan for 10 week term 1st week is gathering prior knowledge and exposure to the topic and 10th week is assessment (I also leaving one week in the middle for revision / catch up / over lap)
- 3. Start with what I think they will know (base it on minimal prior knowledge for their grade level according to curriculum tools from point 1;
- 4. Plan as best you can and try to involve the students as much as you can (classroom culture);
- 5. Trial and test engaging lessons and don't be afraid to adjust your planning or lessons along the way... remember effective teaching is flexible;
- 6. Seek support from mentors and peer teachers as collaboration has saved my sanity more times than I can count;

- ✓ GATHER PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF STUDENTS & ASSESS 'WHAT THEY KNOW': Mind-maps & info graphics are brilliant for this;
- ✓ ALWAYS have a plan of how to 'adjust' the learning to support learners (allow time for teacher-student support or how to break down the tasks or extend the learning);
 - ✓ ASSESSMENT is usually a portfolio sample with the curriculum code and level of achievement (more about this in assessment series);
- ✓ KEEP IT FLEXIBLE & SIMPLE WHEN STARTING try not to 'stress' yourself out by putting in lots of complicated and high prep lessons.
- ✓ ENJOY & HAVE FUN one thing I have learnt is to keep an element of 'fun' in my lessons. Students learn more from someone the 'like' (Rita Pierson) & using images and text to record and reflect are known to improve memory retention by 30%

Notify parents of the topic that students will be learning. Invite them to be share their cultural values, traditions, languages, celebrations, backgrounds, religions, countries of origin that they have at home (optional) but provide avenue to correspond.


Set up space in room to display work/discussions.


Seek/invite parental input for activity suggestions for their own cultures, that they would like to share.
